Given the nature of the eligibility requirements, we advise soliciting reference letters from former graduate school professors or instructors and colleagues or managers from relevant workplaces or internship programs.

NDSR-NY Applicant Instructions

Application video or online project

The video or online project should answer the question, "Why are you interested in digital stewardship?" The piece does not need to be technically perfect or professionally edited, but it should show your ability to communicate through spoken language, visual images, or other means. It can use original or stock footage, still images, text, screen casts, animations or any other moving image medium that communicates your message. Online projects can utilize a variety of platforms and approaches in answering the same question. The key point is to convince a viewer/user of your interest in digital preservation and why you would make a good advocate for, and practitioner of, digital stewardship as part of the NDSR program. The NDSR-NY program may ask those accepted to the program to allow their videos or online projects to be posted online publicly, so you should have the rights to use any embedded material or cite your sources properly under fair use. Applications submitted without videos or online projects will not be considered.

Include the URL of your video or online project on Page 1 of this application if it is accessible online, otherwise email a zip file to ndsr@metro.org with your name and "Video/Online Project" in the subject line.

Cover letter

The cover letter should provide a clear statement of your goals and demonstrate an understanding of, or interest in, digital preservation as a profession. It should discuss relevant leadership, professional service, outcomes from coursework, and work or internship experiences. Applicants may also choose to discuss the three projects they are more interested in working on.

Reference Letters

References should email their letters to ndsr@metro.org from their own e- mail accounts with your name and "Reference Letter" in the subject line.

Submit Application by May 30, 2014

Residents should create a single PDF file of the application and supporting documents and email it to ndsr@metro.org with "[Your Name] - Application" in the subject line by May 30, 2014.
